Potholes

In the 2019-09 issue of this newsletter, we reported that many streets in Mayfair are in very poor condition, and need potholes repaired, or resurfaced. There was significant progress made during the latter half of the summer of 2018 with requests to the Alderman's office, and calls to 311.

Many of the potholes were filled by the beginning of winter, but the snow and freezing seems to have undone the work, and they need filling again.

Missing Street Signs

We are pleased to report that we consider this item complete!

In the 2019-09 issue of this newsletter, we reported that the one-way sign at the southwest corner of Lawrence and Kildare had been knocked down again, and needed to be replaced. The sign has been replaced. The sign got knocked down in 2018 at this location as well; hopefully it will fare better the second time around!

Also in 2018, we asked the Alderman's office to add a one-way sign at Keeler and Lawrence near the War Memorial, because the two signs that face Lawrence say "Do Not Enter", but people did not always see this. One-way signs have now placed.

Repairs needed on garden fencing, and cement around bump-out gardens on Lawrence

In the 2019-09 issue of the newsletter, we reported that the metal garden fencing and cement around the bump-out gardens at the southeast and southwest corners of Lowell and Lawrence needed repairs. This is still the case, and the Alderman's office said, as of 2/4/2019, that they're looking for community partners to help fund the repairs, as the ward's 2020 menu dollars have already been allocated through the Participatory Budgeting, and for dire street and sidewalk repairs.

Updates from the Alderman

Participatory Budgeting Projects Funded

Congratulations! Thank you to all the neighbors who voted in the first-ever cycle of participatory budgeting in the 39th Ward. All projects were submitted by 39th Ward residents, carefully vetted and selected by a committee of dedicated community members, and voted on by 39th Ward residents. Over 1,200 community members voted online, in-person, and at pop-up voting locations to choose the top projects that will be funded in 2020.

Sewer Project at Irving Park and Pulaski until late March

The intersections of Irving Park and Pulaski Roads will be undergoing a sewer project, beginning this month until late March 2020. The 1st stage of the project will involve a complete closure of the Northwest and Southwest corners of Irving Park and Pulaski. Northbound traffic at the Southeast corner will only be one way going East to Irving Park Rd. Stage 2 of the project will have Irving Park Rd. gradually opening while portions of the North and South bound lanes of Pulaski will be used as entry points for businesses at their respective corners. We hope to minimize

the traffic headaches this will cause, but the City is committed to solving some of the flooding issues in this area so appreciate your patience with this.

In Stage 1, southbound Pulaski traffic will be prohibited south of Irving Park starting sometime in January and all of February 2020. Northbound Pulaski traffic will have to turn right at Irving Park. Tanker trucks will need to use northbound Pulaski to get into the gas station on the NE corner during Stage 1, which we anticipate to start in January and finish sometime in February. The station on the NW corner will have to use southbound Pulaski. Businesses on the SW corner will have to use the alleys or the Irving Park driveways into Walgreens.

Stages 2 & 3 will open up Irving Park traffic. In Stage 2, businesses on the southwest corner will still need to use either the Irving Park entrance to Walgreens or the alleys west and south of Walgreens for Stages 1 & 2, which will be through February 2020.

During Stage 3 in March, businesses on the SW corner will be able to use southbound Pulaski for entrance but will have to exit through the alleys.

Welcome to the “Business Buzz”, where we highlight businesses located in and around our Mayfair neighborhood. Have you ever wondered what lurks within the industrial park along Knox south of Montrose Ave?



Did you even know there was an industrial park just west of the Montrose Blue Line stop?

In my 30 years as a Mayfair resident it never occurred to me to venture too far south on Knox at Montrose. Those big buildings were always a mystery to me and not very interesting. What kind of fool am I??

Last Monday night I attended a business networking event held at 2112 Inc. located at 4255 N Knox, home of Fort Knox Studios. What? Huh? Fort Knox?? 2112, Inc. is a 20,000 square foot business incubator for creative types working in music, film/video, fashion, sports, interactive/immersive technology and lifestyle brands. That’s a lot of real estate, and yet 2112’s 20,000 square feet is comfortably situated within 160,000 square feet of space operated by Fort Knox Studios, a recording and performance space and home to 92 band rehearsal rooms, 32 music production studios, 6 recording studios, a 7,200 square foot film and video production family, 4 live sound

production companies, a 30 seat theater and additional office space.



Who knew? Who knew that our own little northwest corner of Chicago was home to a massive mecca of creative entrepreneurs committed to supporting Illinois’ nearly 1 billion dollar creative industry? According to 2112 director Scott Fetters, he and his fellow directors, Amor Montes de Oca and Rob Tovar, looked all over Chicago before finding the square footage they needed to support their mission. They were drawn to our neighborhood by its access to the Blue Line, the Metra and our proximity to downtown and the airport. A side benefit, according to Fetters, has been access to the creatives who live and work in the area as well as the creative vibe in Six Corners.

By mid-winter, 2112 Inc. will be launching the Center for Creative Entrepreneurship, whose focus will be training creative entrepreneurs in the areas of finance, law, sales and marketing.
